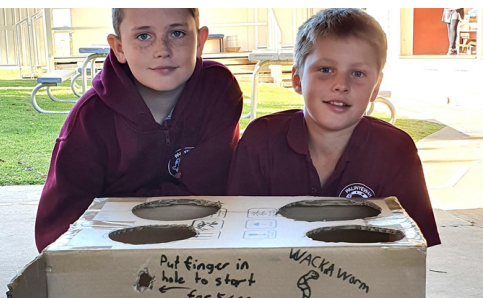

Congratulations is in order!



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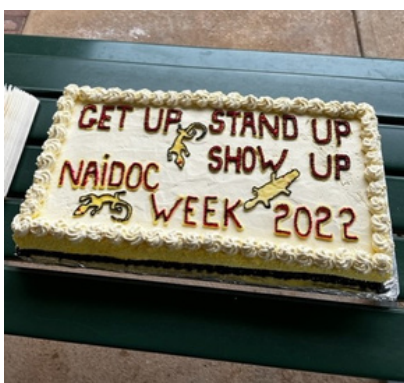
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# NAIDOC DAY

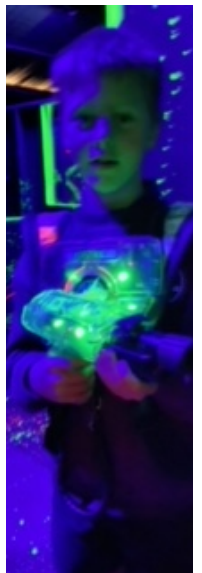
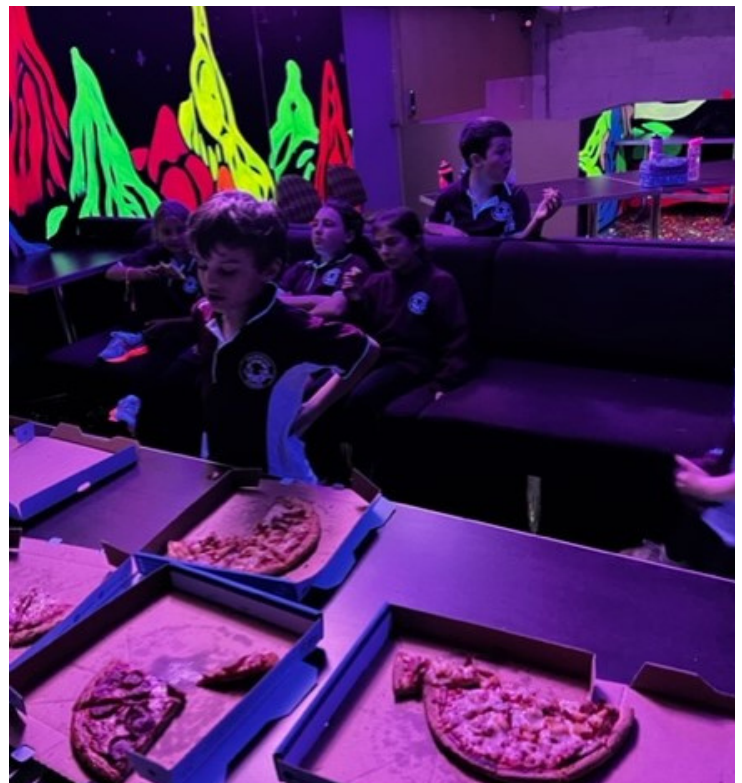
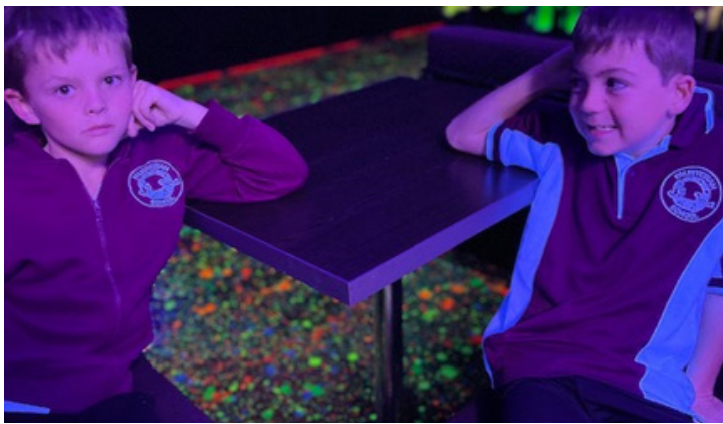
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# MILDURA REWARDS DAY
